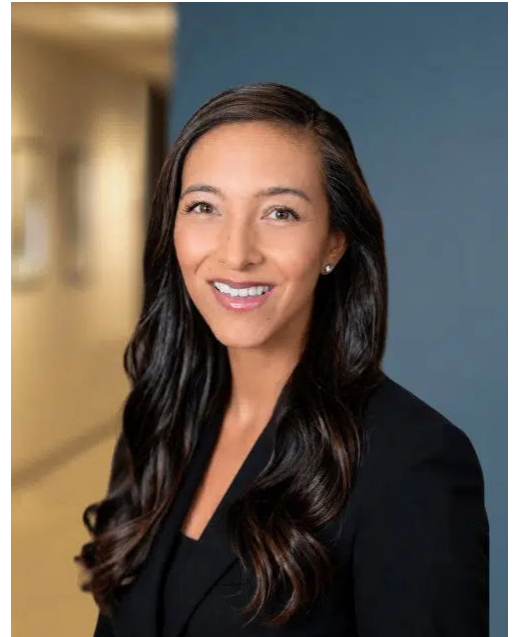

EXPERIENCE:

Ms. Margolies graduated with a B.A. in Political Science and Women's Studies from San Diego State University. She went on to attend the University of San Diego School of Law on an academic scholarship and received her Juris Doctorate with a concentration in Criminal Litigation.

Prior to her commitment to police liability defense, Ms. Margolies interned in the San Diego County District Attorney's Office in their Sex Crimes and Stalking, and Family Protection divisions. She provided pro bono services to the Legal Aid Society assisting with translation services for Spanish-speaking victims of domestic violence. Ms. Margolies also interned with the San Diego County Public Defender's Office working on all levels of criminal cases in both the Central Misdemeanor Unit and the Major Crimes Division, where she second chaired a felony-murder trial.

Ms. Margolies has spent her career defending peace officers and public entities throughout California. Her practice areas have included all aspects of representation of law enforcement, including officer-involved shooting incidents, in-custody deaths, Internal Affairs investigations, criminal defense, and administrative defense of disciplinary actions. For nearly a decade, Ms. Margolies served as a PORAC panel attorney, defending local, state, and federal officers in discipline proceedings, arbitrations, and administrative hearings. Ms. Margolies has also provided training seminars, including legal updates, best practices on investigations, and advisal on the Procedural Safety Officers Bill of Rights to local agencies.

Additionally, Ms. Margolies has served as lead counsel on several oral arguments and briefings in Superior Court and has argued successfully several times before the California Court of Appeal, Fourth Appellate District.

Ms. Margolies' current practice encompasses all aspects of civil litigation relating to the defense of California public entities, including wrongful death, civil rights, police liability, and appellate practice. She has experience in all phases of litigation, including responding to written discovery, drafting and arguing dispositive motions in court, taking and defending depositions, mediations, and settlement negotiations, examining witnesses in trial and preparing post-trial motions and appellate briefing. Ms. Margolies has had exceptional success disposing of cases by way of pre-trial motions and has unique experience with issues related to public entity defense. Most recently, Ms. Margolies sat second chair at trial in Los Angeles on a federal civil rights case against her law enforcement clients and obtained a full defense verdict.
